The Programme Structure

- Lessons will take part in the Summer Term as part of our PSHE designated lesson time
- Lessons may include; discussions, presentations, questions, written work, music and songs, prayer, reflections
- Each year has a theme to explore with 3 underlying objectives under; Social and Emotional, Physical and Spiritual
- · Children may be taught in smaller groups for some lessons
- Some lessons in UKS2 may be taught in single sex groups as appropriate
- Before the programme begins, ground rules will be set with the children regarding the kind of positive behaviour expected of every child
- All children and teachers treat each other with respect, all questions and answers are listened to in a sensitive and sensible manner

Although a hundred sperm cells may reach the egg cell only one sperm can enter the egg to fertilise it.

(2) Understand how a child grows within the mother's womb.



After a few days, the cell divides repeatedley to form a ball of cells.



After 8 weeks, the baby has eyes but no eyelids.

It starts making its first tiny movements, but its mother cannot feel them yet.



After 16 weeks, the baby begins to swallow and pass urine. It has fingers and toenails. At this stage its skin is bright red and transparent.



After 24 weeks, the baby can hear voices and other sounds from outside its mother. It has some hair and eyebrows and eyelashes. Its skin is very wrinkled,



After 28 weeks, the baby's kicks are quite strong and can be felt by putting a hand on the mother's tummy.



After 36 weeks, the baby has taken up its final position in the uterus. Its lungs are getting ready to take their first breath.

The baby continues to get fatter. Some time after 36 weeks, the baby's head is now positioned ready for birth. The baby could arrive any time between 38th and 42nd week of pregnancy.
