A plea from the Chair of trustees Peter Schofield on behalf of Mid Cheshire Foodbank 'Could I ask you to please support the Mid Cheshire Foodbank at your Harvest Festival celebration this year. A food crisis can be reached at any time by any household, it takes a small change in income to make it difficult to meet outgoing commitments, and that is where we help. We support households who are in a food crisis, giving an opportunity to work with our referrers without the additional worry about where the next meal is coming from, that lifts a big burden. We have eight local distribution points across Northwich and Winsford ensuring food is available in both towns every weekday, there are also additional mobile services to rural areas.

Between April 2022 and March 2023 we supplied 3457 food parcels, 52% of the households accessed the food bank for the first time. Each parcel had at least 5 days of food, including fresh fruit and veg, bread and eggs - or put another way that is 44 650 days' worth of food, 133 950 meals, or even more graphically for a younger audience, food to feed 1 person for 122 years! Every weekday we distribute 480kg of food - equivalent to the weight of a Highland Cow!

These figures are not reducing, inevitably the donations we receive are barely keeping pace with the demand as the cost of living bites into household budgets. The generosity of our community at times like Harvest are vital for us, ensuring we can meet the ongoing demand for help.'
