WORKING TOGETHER to SAFEGUARDING OUR PREMISES

Please note that the school premises begin at the top of the drive on Keepers Lane
At the start of the school day, pupils MUST be supervised by an adult when entering the school premises. Please wait with your child/ren in the playground until the morning doors are opened at 8.45am and a member of staff can supervise your hand over.

There have been an increasing number of pupils who are experiencing a 'stop and drop' on Keepers Lane. Often these children are left to enter school unsupervised, upset, and separate from their sibling or even running back to find their adults. These children are comforted and supported by kind parents who notice they are unsupervised and bring them into school.
